1. **Apologies**

2. **Minutes of the meeting of 5/7/18**

3. **Matters arising from the last minutes**

There were no matters arising from the last minutes

4. **Repair of netting structures**

It was reported that the eastern netting structure was unsafe due to rusted supports. Litter bags had been deposited by the Pavilion, and the rear needs to be covered with sheet material to prevent access

5. **Wild area: discussion of project plan**

Application has been made to the Herapath-Shenton Trust for installing a swings unit, and a response is awaited.

Cllr Allen will begin work on the meadow in the week beginning 24/9/18, and it was suggested that a flyer be delivered to local houses explaining what was happening.

Cllr Allen is able to shred the waste vegetation. An access down the slope to the meadow will be needed, and clearance will be carried out to 6 metres beyond the old swing frame.

Cllr Corbett suggested seeking funding from YOGOFF to extend this project. He will also approach the Delphi Lake Trust for the Pavilion project.

Cllr Cronin reported that he had managed to contact Kompan regarding its estimate for the swing unit, but had had no response since.

6. Replacement of Pavilion

Martyn Collinson reported that Y&CFC had asked for a meeting, which he had declined as he felt it would be pointless until the Club was in a position to make a firm proposal. Since then, no meaningful response had been received. He then circulated pictures of possible replacements for the Pavilion. Yarmouth Town Trust is currently holding the £2500 which YHC had granted for this project.
