### **3. Matters arising from the last minutes**

Installation of the swings unit has been completed and the unit has  
proved popular.

Installation of the Board Rider also has been completed. It was decided  
to leave attaching the strap until spring

### **4. Meadow: discussion of progress**

Brighstone Landscaping have been asked to add cutting the meadow to  
their itinerary.

### **5. Replacement of Pavilion**

Martyn Collinson reported that the area around the Pavilion had  
become overgrown, and Brighstone Landscaping have quoted £300 for  
its clearance, which he will recommend to Yarmouth Town Trust.

Demolition of the Pavilion: it was reported that planning permission for  
a replacement structure will not be necessary. Martyn has obtained an  
estimate of around £10K for supply and erection of a suitable building  
from RHF, an image of which he presented. He undertook to clarify the  
materials to be used for the construction. It was agreed that concrete

would be a more suitable material for the base, and that it would be necessary to place benches within the structure

The owner of Park Cottage and agreed to clearance of the weeds which are encroaching onto the Rec from his property.

It was agreed for the Clerk to ask Island Roads to treat the large bench outside St James Church.

It was reported that the mole problem at the Rec had recurred.
